



## **World Multiplication Table Day – free event for schools**

**WMTD has been celebrated since 2011. The next edition (the eighth) will be observed on September 28, 2018. This is a great occasion in schools, lasting up to several weeks. Students memorize the multiplication table by playing various games. The culminating moment is the day of examinations, which are administered according to the slogan “When kids test adults on their multiplication skills!”. Roles are exchanged: children become examiners, adults examinees. Over 500,000 participants, from Russia, Poland, Peru, Colombia, Switzerland, and many other countries, took part in the previous edition of this campaign.**

Committees are organized in schools. Everyone wishing to pass the multiplication table exam goes up to the committee’s table and draws a random exam card from the basket. Each card includes five questions from the multiplication table. Anyone who answers all five questions correctly receives the title of “Multiplication Table Expert” and a symbolic ID card.

Meanwhile, special patrols roam outside the school grounds and interview passers-by at random—for example, in parks. They also visit offices, radio stations, and police stations, accompanied by colorful banners with the campaign slogan, balloons, and other items.

Any educational facility can take part in the event. The WMTD campaign is organized according to one of three options: minimal (WMTD in class), standard (WMTD in school), and expanded (WMTD in school and in the town or city). More information: <https://www.wmtday.org/participation-rules>

Those interested in participating in the campaign need to fill out the registration form on the website <https://www.wmtday.org/registration-2018>. Once the application is confirmed, the facility will receive (electronically) a licensing certificate, which is available following login on the campaign web page, which also features materials helpful for organization, for example, exam cards, game scenarios, posters, puzzles, and many more. The Local Coordinator, usually a math teacher, is the individual responsible for organizing the event at the school.

Registration for the next (8th) edition of the campaign, which will take place on September 28, lasts until September 22, 2018.
